Speaker profiles

Duffy Dillon – Head Coach of Fort Lauderdale Aquatics, a USA Swimming Silver Medal club in the Florida Gold Coast LSC. At the helm of FLA, Duffy oversees broad-based aquatics programming which, in addition to the club team, incorporates a Masters team as well as programs for swimming lessons, swimming camps and diversity/outreach. He is a past member of the Board of Directors for USA Swimming, and served as General Chair of his LSC. He has been a head coach for the past 14 years, and coaching for over 20 years. He is an ASCA Level 5 certified coach.

Ad'm Dusenbury – Ad'm is currently the 13/14 Division Director at the Mission Viejo Nadadores in California. He began coaching for the Nadadores in May 2005, and since then has become an integral part of the program. He currently coaches swimmers in their last age-group group before they venture into senior level swimming. Prior to coaching with Mission Viejo, Ad'm coached club, college and high school swimming in San Antonio--for Alamo Area Aquatics, Trinity University and Clark High School.

Ron Forrest – At FAST in Fort Worth since 1996, Ron is one of the best established club coaches in the USA. He's a member of the USA National Team Coaches Roster, has qualified swimmers for the Olympic Games, the World Championships, Pan American Games, and Commonwealth Games. He's been the 2002 and 2004 Texas Senior Coach of the Year, ASCA Award of Excellence in 2002-'06. He's coached 22 Junior National qualifiers, 25 US Open qualifiers, 2 Olympic Trials qualifiers, and 2 Olympians, in addition to numerous top age group swimmers.

John Leonard – ASCA Executive Director since 1985, Jon is one of the best known names in swimming today. He's lectured all over the world, and serves on multiple USA Swimming committees, as well as the FINA Coaches Commission. Here, John will present the **ASCA Stroke School** with a vast assortment of new and interesting videos of world-class swimmers and will focus on the creation of great strokes in Age Group swimmers.

Steve Lochte – Coach of the Daytona Beach Speed in Florida, and father and coach of superstar Ryan Lochte, Steve has built a strong and consistent program in Daytona, which previous to his arrival was not a hotbed of swimming. His career began in snowy Rochester, New York where he first began producing outstanding athletes. Steve is a popular and engaging speaker, and we're pleased to bring him to the Legends of Texas Clinic for the first time.

Jesse Vassallo – Jesse's personal swimming career made him the most famous swimmer in history from the Caribbean, setting his first World Record at age 17. As a swimmer, he's a member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame. He has served five years as President of the Puerto Rico Swimming Federation, and moved back to South Florida in 2008 to coach in Fort Lauderdale. He is the Head Age Group Coach of Fort Lauderdale Aquatics.
